Post 16 Tuition Fund

The Doncaster UTC will use the Post 16 tuition fund to support students by:

Very small group provision for maths and English resit. Maximum group size for these resits will be 4 students. Students with a level 4 will be given an opportunity to join a resit group to achieve a level 5.

Students with level 4s in maths and English will be supported in their studies by engaging in additional courses to improve their skills in these areas. Core maths and the epq have been selected and deployed to make sure that our students will catch up and further develop their skills in their area of weakness. The core maths provision will be entirely taught by the maths faculty, and epq will be primarily taught by the English faculty, to ensure students make the best possible progress and build transferable numeracy and literacy skills, to catch up the progress they lost due to lost time from the coronavirus.

The first priority for the funding will be the student who failed to achieve a level 4 in maths or English, the next priority will be those trying to achieve a level 5.

Other students with grade 4s will be supported by remapping the curriculum to boost the literacy and numeracy skills for other courses.

Students with identified additional needs or who have suffered additional disruption will also be supported through small group work focusing on their maths and English to ensure this is not a limiting factor in their achievement

All additional activities will be provided by fully qualified UTC staff, usually experienced teachers in their own field of delivery

The Doncaster UTC will:

- Provide a statement about the use of funding on the website in the autumn term
- record the use of the funding, including reference to the individual students that receive the support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered, and retain the necessary evidence of the tuition provided
- deliver the extra tuition and spend the associated funding in the 2020 to 2021 academic year
- notify ESFA of any unspent funding from this fund for it to be reclaimed
