OUR CURRICULUM


In year 9, students will experience a broad curriculum. All students will study:


English Literature English Language Mathematics Science Citizenship Physical Education

In addition to this all students have chosen two options from either the Engineering specialism or Digital Media and Computing; as well as two further choices. Enrichment and Employer projects are also built into the school day.

Students will be given baseline assessments in September so that we can quickly and accurately understand their strengths and tailor our planning and teaching to meet their needs. We place a strong focus on reading, literacy and numeracy; and will work purposefully to address any gaps in our student's learning.

EMPLOYER LED PROJECTS

These are built into your school day and will run on a Tuesday for students on the Engineering pathway, and on a Thursday for those on the Creative and Digital pathway. These will be large creative projects that not only link to your specialism but also to the world of work. You will be completing one across each term, with the opportunity to present your finished work at the end of the project to a wide audience. They have been designed with our Employer partners so that you can put your learning into practice. This will be an excellent opportunity to develop your employability skills and to work with others across your specialism. Our employer partners will also be visiting at these times to work with you. It is a fantastic opportunity to meet them and make an excellent impression. In the future they will be offering work experience and also be on the lookout for placements apprentices. You will want to impress!



As well as the core curriculum and subject specialisms; here at Doncaster UTC we will also be working with you to develop your employability skills. This will be through project work, enrichment opportunities, employer visits as well as in the classroom day to day. Our employer partners have identified these as being the key qualities that they look for when they are recruiting. They will be working with us and you to develop these to ensure that you are the best version of yourself that you can be when you leave us for your future career path.

ENRICHMENT

This time is also built into your school day and will run on a Tuesday for students on the Creative and Digital pathway, and on a Thursday for those on the Engineering pathway. This will be a time to explore your interests outside of the existing curriculum. You will be able to opt into whichever interest you would like to pursue at that time. Whether that be learning a language, developing your art skills, joining the school newspaper or debating club, a sports club or even chess; we are sure that there will be something for everyone. Another opportunity to develop those employability skills and to work with others across your specialism.

BEHAVIOUR AND STANDARDS

We expect exceptionally high personal standards from all of our students. This will include their appearance, the way in which they conduct themselves at all times at the UTC and the way in which they interact with one another.

MOBILE PHONES

Students may bring their mobile phone to the UTC for use during the journey to and from school. However, mobile phones are not allowed to be used at any time during the UTC day unless as part of an arranged, teacher led activity. UNIFORM

MONEY AND PAYMENTS

The Doncaster UTC operates a no-cash policy. There is no requirement for any child to bring money into school. You will receive a SIMS PAY account for use at the UTC.

You will be sent for September a bespoke login. Here you can manage, top-up and pay for most things using your own user profile.

All payments (dinner money, trips, uniform purchases) are made via this website. We recommend £12.50 per week dinner money as a guideline (£2.50 minimum meal deal per day, supplied by our caterers).

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earning from up to three of your most recent assessment periods). Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the qualifying benefits:


Income Support Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 The guarantee element of Pension Credit Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after the person stops qualifying for working tax credit

FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND PUPIL PREMIUM

For every child in receipt of Free School Meals Doncaster UTC receives additional funding to support their learning.

This is called the Pupil Premium. This means that even if your child does not wish to receive a Free School Meal it is essential that all eligible families apply.





TRAVEL TO THE UTC

Doncaster UTC is centrally located and accessible via existing local transport links. Doncaster railway station is 600m from the UTC which is a nine-minute walk.

Doncaster is a mainline station and well connected to nearby towns and cities. Doncaster central bus interchange is located next to the railway station and connects the town to all areas across the borough with regular services throughout the day.

The UTC will be equipped with secure cycle storage facilities for those who wish to make use of the ever extending cycle network throughout Doncaster
